This motion approves the contract with McMillian Group, Inc. for the demolition and authorizes the Mayor and City Clerk to sign the contract of behalf of the City. The Comptroller's Office is authorized by this motion to return the bid bonds to the unsuccessful bidders. 17-368 Motion by Councilman Muscat, seconded by Councilman Kosinski, to approve the contract with McMillian Group, Inc. for the abatement and demolition of the structures on and restoration of the properties at 23410 Hanover, 23470 Hanover and 23480 Hanover for an amount not to exceed \$50,300.00 as outlined in Item 9-A. This motion further authorizes payment upon successful completion for these properties covered under the Hazard Mitigation Grant. Per Administrative Assistant Laslo, communication dated October 11, 2017.

17-369 Motion by Councilwoman Hicks-Clayton, seconded by Councilman Muscat, to approve the agreement with Ulliance, Inc. to allow the City to continue to offer Employee Assistance Program (EAP) services to City employees and their families as outlined in Item 9-B. Per the agreement, the cost per employee will remain at \$2.50 per month which translates to approximately \$2,000.00 per quarter. Per Human Resource Director Sobota-Perry, communication dated November 6, 2017.

17-370 Motion by Councilman Kosinski, seconded by Councilman Abdallah, to agree with the recommendation of Human Resource Director Sobota-Perry to approve the retention of Plante Moran Group Benefit Advisors (PMGBA) and to sublicense with HCM File to implement reporting provisions (Section 6055/6056) that the City of Dearborn Heights has under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) as outlined in Item 9-C. Per Human Resource Director Sobota-Perry, communication dated November 6, 2017.

17-371 Motion by Councilwoman Hicks-Clayton, seconded by Councilman Abdallah, to approve Fire Chief Brogan's request for the purchase of three Stryker Power Pro XT cots with performance loading plates at a cost of \$54,073.00 including installation as outlined in Item 9-D. This motion further approves payment upon receipt of the cots that will be used in the Fire Department's first line squads. The AFG Grant will cover \$32,400.00 with the remaining \$21,673.00 to come out of Capital Outlay. Per Fire Chief Brogan, communication dated October 23, 2017.

17-372 Motion by Councilwoman Horvath, seconded by Councilman Abdallah, to approve the payment of \$25,000.00 to cover the cost of the IAFF Peer Fitness Class that the City will be hosting next year as outlined in Item 9-E. This cost will be reimbursed 100% through fireworks funding from the communities who are participating. Per Fire Chief Brogan, communication dated November 9, 2017.

17-373 Motion by Councilman Kosinski, seconded by Councilman Muscat, to concur with the request of Public Service Administrator Zimmer to approve Wade Trim Associates, Inc. to complete the Water System Asset Management Plan for the City's drinking water system by January 1, 2018 for an amount not to exceed \$10,200.00 as outlined in Item 9-F. The submittal of an Asset Management Plan to the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality is a requirement of the Michigan Safe Water Drinking Act. Per Public Service Administrator Zimmer, communication dated November 4, 2017.

17-374 Motion by Councilman Muscat, seconded by Councilwoman Hicks-Clayton, to approve to scrap the 1994 Dump Truck and have the dump boxes switched to the 2004 Dump Truck by Cannon Truck Equipment as outlined in Item 9-G. The City will receive a \$300.00 credit for the scrap value of the 1994 truck which will be applied towards the cost to have the dump boxes switched. Per Public Service Administrator Zimmer, communication dated November 6, 2017.

17-375 Motion by Councilwoman Horvath, seconded by Councilman Kosinski, to approve Payment Application No. 1 for the Parkland Park Restroom Replacement Project submitted by the Cedroni Associates, Inc. in the total amount of \$43,386.30 and authorize the City Comptroller to make the payment as outlined in Item 9-H. Funds for this project have been previously approved in the CDBG Program. Per Recreation Director Grybel, communication dated October 30, 2017.

17-376 Motion by Councilman Kosinski, seconded by Councilman Muscat, to agree with Police Chief Gavin for the purchase and payment upon receipt of four ERA Henry 24 Hour Intensive Use Chairs from Beyond the Door, Ltd. for a total amount of \$5,423.96 as outlined in Item 9-I. The entire payment, net 30 days, for this expenditure will be paid from the Police Contractual Services Account. Reimbursement will be made through Jag Grant Funds in the amount of \$3,781.00 with the remaining \$1,642.96 from the Police Contractual Services Account. This motion further approves the check from JAG Funds, upon receipt, to be deposited into the Police Contractual Services Account. Per Police Chief Gavin, communication dated October 18, 2017.

17-377 Motion by Councilman Muscat, seconded by Councilman Kosinski, to approve the purchase and payment upon receipt of 10 Body Microphones and Chargers from L3 Mobile Vision for a total amount of \$2,665.00, including \$15.00 shipping, as outlined in Item 9-J. The initial payment, net 30 days, for this expenditure will be paid from the Police Contractual Services Account and reimbursement will be received from Jag Grant Funds. This motion further approves the check from JAG Funds, upon receipt, to be deposited into the Police Contractual Services Account. Per Police Chief Gavin, communication dated October 18, 2017.

17-378 Motion by Councilwoman Horvath, seconded by Councilman Abdallah, to adopt the resolution as required by the Wayne County Department of Public Services to obtain the Right-of-Way Permit for the construction of the Beech Daly Road Water Main Improvements from Hass Avenue to Ford Road as outlined in Item 11-A. The Beech Daly Road water main will be abandoned in place and the resolution requires the City to maintain ownership responsibilities for the abandoned water main. Per Public Service Administrator Zimmer, communication dated November 6, 2017.

17-379 Motion by Councilwoman Hicks-Clayton, seconded by Councilman Kosinski, to approve the business license renewals for Livernois Motorsports and Engineering, 2500 S. Gulley; Mexican Fiesta, 24310 Ford; and Van Born Tavern and Grill, 22426 Van Born.

Per Police Chief Gavin, communication dated October 20, 2017.
